

## Nov. 13th, 2019- Second Homeowners Community Meeting

- Sunday, Nov 17th at noon a generator safety and maintenance class is scheduled at the command center. Will be recorded and posted to Elbow Cay Recovery facebook page
- Elbowcay.org website is live and updated with useful information, donation needs lists, and meeting notes
- If you need customs forms stamped you can do so through Hope Town Council office
  - Two customs brokers have reopened to service Marsh Harbour
    - Arawak Agencies
    - Fredericks Agency
- Three cash for work crews funded by Hopetown United are working under Help.ngo
  - Servicing all parts of the island with crews stationed north, south and central

- To request a muck and gut, cistern rehabilitation or pool draining service from Samaritan's Purse, visit or send a representative to their office, set up at 'Puff House' in town, or email [jweppner@samaritan.org](mailto:jweppner@samaritan.org) for further coordination
- Samaritan's Purse is expected to expand debris removal activities with the arrival of heavy equipment to aid in larger debris removal
- One barge load a day has been removing debris from the Elbow Cay Club staging site
- North End debris staging area is being established so that debris and machinery will not have to be transported through town
  - Another site has been established in White Sound to service the south end
  - There has been an identified need for another site to service areas across the harbour that are not accessible by road
